



Sport Premium Spending Plan 2017-2018

What is PE & Sport Premium funding?

The PE & Sport Premium is additional government funding aimed at making additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and Sport.

How did the school spend its PE & Sport Premium allocation?

For 2017-2018 Beecholme Primary School received £8930 PE & Sports Premium funding. The table below shows how we are planning to spend our allocation:

Amount allocated	Allocation	How will this support PE and Sport?
£450	Providing continued swimming for Years 4.	Continued swimming lessons in Year 4 which will result in greater water confidence and an increase in the numbers of children with the ability to swim 25m unaided.
£590	Additional Booster sessions for Year 6 pupils who cannot swim 25 metres.	This will bring Beecholme in line with National legislation for all Year 6 pupils to be competent swimmers.
£1427	After school clubs and lunchtime activities led by sports coaches and staff	Sports coaches and staff run after school clubs and lunchtime activities to enhance overall skills. This will encourage further participation into competitions in the local Borough and Cluster events. We anticipate additional coaching will enable the pupils to achieve better results as well as feel more confident in the events that they are competing in.
£4428	MSSP Get Set Specialist Sports provision	Specialist training for staff to ensure all pupils benefit from regular high quality coaching in PE lessons. This will develop skills in all Key Stages enhancing teaching staff confidence in a variety of sports and activities.
£185	Sports Training and PE Conference	Designated PE Teacher to attend training conference on 02.07.18. Cover to be provided to ensure staff have relevant CPD opportunities.
£600	PE and Sports equipment (curriculum and active play)	New equipment will support and improve the PE curriculum, to ensure that teachers and coaches are well equipped and that children have the necessary resources to benefit fully.
£450	PE and sports equipment (lunchtime and After School Clubs)	New equipment will improve the quality of lunchtime and After School Clubs, to provide better opportunities for children to benefit from a range of clubs.
£550	Children involvement in cluster group sports events.	To take groups of children to sports festivals and events with local schools. Contribution towards the East Mitcham Cluster fee and teacher release. Competitions Beecholme pupils will be participating in this academic year are:

What was the impact of PE & Sport Premium Spending in 2017/18?

The PE & Sport premium at Beecholme primary has;

- Increased the engagement of both staff and pupils in PE and Sport. Our PE specialists have provided Teachers with training which has built confidence and skills in physical education;
- Encouraged participation in after school clubs such as Various Sports, Bike Club, Football Club and Keep Fit Club;
- Provided regular swimming sessions enabling pupil confidence with pupils working towards competently swimming at 25 metres by the end of KS2;
- Developed a great collaboration and increased participation with the East Mitcham Cluster with regular involvement in local competitions;
- The PE and Sports equipment purchased enhanced the delivery of the PE curriculum as pupils across all Key Stages learn through play and activity to develop healthy lifestyles;
- Lunch time activities have benefited from the new resources enabling children to keep fit and develop motor and complex skills at break and lunch times.
- allowed effective training for the PE lead via PE conferences and training sessions. This has developed a drive in the curriculum for PE with effective sessions being planned for Beecholme pupils.
