

Reading, Writing and Communication

We will use a variety of stories, such as nursery rhymes and traditional tales, to encourage the children to re-tell stories, join in with repeated language, to build up everyday vocabulary and to begin to add meanings to the marks that they make on paper.

Maths

We will be looking at numbers, shapes, measure and patterns everywhere that we work. We will be encouraging children to use mathematical vocabulary correctly whilst building, making, role-playing and giving out the fruit.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

To learn as much as we can about your children we will be looking at families, where we live, what we like to do, what we like to eat and how we are all similar but also different.

Physical Development

The children will be encouraged to take part in activities to help keep them fit and healthy whilst also exercising the smaller muscles within their hands with finger gym.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This area will be a very big focus for us, to make sure that all the children settle into their new surroundings and feel happy and safe. How you can help at home

This will help to build up vocabulary and skills at listening carefully to what others are saying. Share a book at bedtime and talk about the pictures. At the park talk about what they are doing and what they can see and hear. Whilst at the shops talk about what you are buying, how much it costs and why you need it. We will also offer other suggestions throughout the term.
